### **Novi Parks Foundation**

The Novi Parks Foundation is a 501c(3) corporation formed to raise funds, advocate, and develop support for the parks, programs, and open space. ### Scholarship Information

The Novi Parks Foundation provides recreational 1. Resident of Novi one or more years scholarships to Novi citizens who meet specific lower income requirements. These scholarships are administered through the Parks Department and have proven to provide many hours of rec- 2. reational enjoyment to the attendees. One of the 3. most popular programs is Camp Lakeshore where one participant can actually receive a 4. scholarship for up to three weeks of camp. Applications are available at the Parks Department 5. and online. The following is a partial list of criteria which must be met when applying for the assistance.

- and ability to confirm residency. (Drivers license, state identification, property tax statement or City of Novi water bill)
- Proof of income W2 form.
- The maximum allowable scholarship per family per year is \$500.00.
- If approved, the scholarship will be valid for four months from the date of approval.
- Scholarship may be rescinded and restitution of any fees paid if scholarship information is falsified.
- Transportation to and from programs/ classes and events, as well as any additional fees associated with the program/class are the responsibility of the scholarship recipient.
