**AUDIENCE COMMENTS:**

Scott Gifford said he has been a resident of Novi for 13 years. He said he learned earlier this year that in 2023, Novi acquired 10 Flock camera to monitor the comings and goings of residents and visitors to Novi. Learning about these cameras perked his ears up to stories he was hearing in the national news about them and what he learned made him concerned for the privacy of his family and fellow residents. He learned about other officers in other communities who would use these cameras to stalk romantic partners. He learned about agencies throughout the country using these cameras to conduct surveillance on protests and activists exercising their First Amendment rights. He learned about data from these cameras unintentionally shared with federal immigration agencies, camera feeds that were fully exposed to the internet and errors with these readers leading to wrongful stops and detentions. Learning about what was happening elsewhere in the country made him start to wonder about how they protect the privacy of the residents of Novi. He began by looking for Flock-related policies on the city's website. When he was unable to find them, he obtained a copy of Novi's Flock contract under the Freedom of Information Act. He said it is a short document agreeing just to the

Flock terms of service from their website which state that Novi “grants Flock a limited, irrevocable, perpetual, worldwide license to use and disclose customer data to provide the Flock services and that Flock’s liability for any misuse of their data, no matter how large, is limited to a partial refund.” He searched the Novi website for ordinances that protect resident privacy from this technology, similar to those passed recently by Detroit, but he was not able to find any such ordinances. He watched the “Now You Novi” episode on Flock cameras which talked in general terms about privacy, and he emailed Chief Zinser to inquire about policies which he graciously shared with Mr. Gifford. He said while he appreciates that they have a Flock policy in place, and he appreciated Chief Zinser’s openness, he is not convinced the policies that he shared with him are adequate to protect against the abuses they’ve seen elsewhere in the country. They honor license plate inquiries from agencies outside of Novi, including ICE. They do not require proactive audits of proper use, and they do not require IT security audits. Chief Zinser mentioned to Mr. Gifford that they are in the process of revising their policies to address some of these issues which Mr. Gifford welcomes. He knows City Council did not intend to compromise residents’ privacy when purchasing these cameras, and from his interview in “Now You Novi,” he knows Police Chief Zinser cares about residents’ privacy. What he is asking for is that these good intentions be codified. As part of a planned update to Novi’s Flock policies, they should include public input, in particular from groups at heightened risks of privacy violations such as immigrants, domestic violence survivors, and activists. Other communities have used town halls to elicit input like this, and he thinks that would be appropriate here. For accountability, the city should publish a privacy audit showing how their privacy is being safeguarded, similar to how they publish financial audits showing how their money is safeguarded. Finally, they should put enforceable protections into ordinance. There are model ordinances they can follow, including Detroit’s, that show how they can require public review, etc.

City Manager Cardenas said both the resolution and the detail for the rollover for this budget amendment should reflect a use of fund balance of \$224,628, bringing the ending fund balance to \$14.4 million. That's due to the rollover dollars that are coming in, so that's increasing expenditures, so that's decreasing the amount in the fund balance. He apologized for that mistake.

Mayor Fischer said overall, it's timing and eventually, this will be put back into fund balance. For right now, they need to show it as a reduction. City Manager Cardenas said that is correct because they are not using any dollars they didn't have budgeted, they're just adding to the budget and that's bringing the expenditures up. Fund balance is a percent of their expenditures. He said because they're adding to it, that's why it's going down a little bit.

City Manager Cardenas said the scope includes 15,200 feet of 14" high-density main and 12" duct iron water main along portions of Eight Mile, Napier and Beck. The water main will be installed through the ITC Sports Park, providing public water access to parks facilities as they make these improvements. This has been on the part of their water sewer master plan for quite some time, and he applauded the teams for bringing this in under budget.
