5	CHAIRPERSON PEHRSON: Call to order
б	the March 8th regular meeting of the Novi Planning
7	Commission.
8	Kirsten, can you call the roll?
9	MS. MELLEM: Member Anthony?
10	MR. ANTHONY: Here.
11	MS. MELLEM: Member Avdoulos.
12	CHAIRPERSON PEHRSON: Absent,
13	excused.
14	MS. MELLEM: Member Giacopetti?
15	CHAIRPERSON PEHRSON: Absent,

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Page 3 1 CHAIRPERSON PEHRSON: Absent, 2 excused. With that, if we could rise for 3 the Pledge of Allegiance, and it would be my honor to 4 hear Mr. Lynch lead us in that. 5 6 (Pledge recited.) 7 CHAIRPERSON PEHRSON: Thank you. 8 Look for a motion to approve the agenda or any 9 modifications thereof. 10 MR. GRECO: Motion to approve. 11 MR. ANTHONY: Second. CHAIRPERSON PEHRSON: All those in 12 13 favor? 14 THE BOARD: Ave. 15 CHAIRPERSON PEHRSON: No one 16 opposed. We have an approved agenda. 17 That brings us to our first 18 audience participation. Seeing no one in the 19 audience, I'm going to take a wild stab that no one 20 wants to speak. So we'll close the first audience 21 participation. 22 Any correspondence? 23 MR. GRECO: No correspondence.

Page 4 CHAIRPERSON PEHRSON: Committee 1 2 reports? The City Planner report. 3 4 Ms. McBeth. Thank you. 5 MS. MCBETH: Good 6 evening. 7 I just wanted to report that at 8 the February 27th City Council meeting, City Council 9 approved the first reading of the zoning map amendment 10 for the property that's located at the southwest 11 corner of Twelve Mile and Taft Road. That was a 12 rezoning from RA (residential acreage) to OST (planned 13 office service technology.) We expect that will go 14 back for a second meeting soon. 15 CHAIRPERSON PEHRSON: Very good. 16 MS. MCBETH: Thank you. 17 CHAIRPERSON PEHRSON: Under our 18 first public hearing, it's a Text Amendment 18.284 for 19 outdoor display and above ground storage tanks. 20 That's a public hearing for the consideration of Text 21 Amendment 18.284 to allow outdoor display in the OSC, Office Service Commercial District, and to allow above 22 23 ground storage tanks in the OST, Planned Office

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1	Service Technology District.
2	Kirsten.
3	MS. MELLEM: Good evening.
4	So the proposed ordinance
5	amendment address two previously approved text
6	amendments from 2014 that were inadvertently excluded
7	from the Clearzoning Ordinance reformatting, and is
8	therefore going through the process to reinstate the
9	ordinance language.
10	The first one is to allow
11	Outdoor Display in connection with a permitted General
12	Hospital use, making it a temporary special land use
13	reviewed by the Building Official. At the February 8,
14	2017 Planning Commission meeting to set the public
15	hearing the members asked for clarification on whether
16	a billboard vehicle would be allowed on the display
17	pad. A billboard vehicle would not be permitted, the
18	text amendment states that only "one sign shall be
19	permitted to be located on the display of no greater
20	than two square feet in area. All other signs as
21	defined in Chapter 28 of the City Code are
22	prohibited."
23	The second item is to allow

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1	outdoor placement of above ground storage tanks in OST
2	with the same conditions as required in I-1 with three
3	modifications proposed. The three modifications are
4	removal of the size limit per storage tank, limiting
5	the location of tanks, and allowing the screening wall
6	material to match the primary building materials.
7	There were no additional changes
8	from the previously approved language currently
9	proposed.
10	The Planning Commission is asked
11	tonight to hold the required public hearing and make a
12	recommendation to the City Council, who will
13	ultimately approve or deny the amendment, and may
14	propose alterations as well. Staff is available to
15	answer any questions you may have regarding the
16	proposed amendment.
17	CHAIRPERSON PEHRSON: Thank you.
18	I'll open it up to the audience
19	for their participation.
20	Seeing no one, we'll close the
21	audience participation.
22	Any memos or letters?
23	MR. GRECO: No memos, letters or

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1	correspondence.
2	CHAIRPERSON PEHRSON: Then we'll
3	close the audience participation and turn it over to
4	the Planning Commission for their consideration.
5	Member Greco.
6	MR. GRECO: I'd like to make a
7	motion to recommend approval to the City Council of
8	Text Amendment 18.284, outdoor display and above
9	ground storage tanks.
10	MR. LYNCH: Second.
11	CHAIRPERSON PEHRSON: There's a
12	motion by Member Greco, second by Member Lynch.
13	Any other comments?
14	Kristen, call the roll.
15	MS. MELLEM: Member Anthony?
16	MR. ANTHONY: Yes.
17	MS. MELLEM: Chair Pehrson?
18	CHAIRMAN PEHRSON: Yes.
19	MS. MELLEM: Member Greco?
20	MR. GRECO: Yes.
21	MS. MELLEM: Member Lynch?
22	MR. LYNCH: Yes.
23	MS. MELLEM: Motion passes four to

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1	zero.
2	CHAIRPERSON PEHRSON: Next is the
3	matters for consideration. Introduce text amendment
4	18.821, Facade Ordinance Update, and it's to set a
5	public hearing for Text Amendment 18.281 - to update
6	Section 5.5, Exterior Building Wall Facade Materials,
7	commonly known as the Facade Ordinance, and to update
8	and clarify the requirements associated with facade
9	materials.
10	Kirsten.
11	MS. MELLEM: Yes.
12	CHAIRPERSON PEHRSON: Good evening
13	again.
14	MS. MELLEM: Good evening.
15	The proposed ordinance
16	amendment addresses the section commonly referred to
17	as the Facade Ordinance under Article 5: Site
18	Standards, Section 5.15: Exterior Building Wall
19	Facade Materials. Over the years it has come to the
20	attention of staff and consultants that there are
21	several areas where further clarification are needed
22	as well as updates to include new materials available
23	to applicants. Therefore, the following proposed

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1	updates to the facade section of the ordinance reflect
2	these needed changes.
3	Some of the items to highlight
4	include:
5	Clarification that the use of
6	color-changing illumination is prohibited.
7	Correcting an error in the slope
8	of the roof in the ordinance.
9	Clarification in plain language
10	that states painting of brick is prohibited. Staff
11	and consultants have always interpreted the ordinance
12	to such effect and are making it clear to applicants
13	that this is the standard.
14	And updates to the schedule
15	regulating facade materials and footnotes.
16	Also included in the packet is a
17	list of the 2015-2016 Section 9 Facade Waivers that
18	were proposed including the language of the motions
19	and type of materials.
20	The Planning Commission is asked
21	tonight to review the proposed amendments, and if
22	acceptable, to set a public hearing. At that time the
23	Planning Commission may make a recommendation to the

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1		City Council, who will ultimately approve or deny the
2		amendment, and may propose alterations as well. Staff
3		is available to answer any questions you may have
4		regarding the proposed amendment.
5		CHAIRPERSON PEHRSON: Thank you.
6		Turning it over to the Planning
7		Commission for consideration.
8		Member Lynch.
9		MR. LYNCH: Yes. The only question
10		I have is about the painting of the brick. Is it my
11		understanding that painting of the brick painting
12		brick has never been approved?
13		MS. MELLEM: Correct. The
14		schedule the schedule of the materials says clay,
15		natural brick, so the interpretation has always been
16		that painted brick is not material that's approved.
17		MR. LYNCH: Does that apply
18		throughout the city including the Town Center?
19		MS. MELLEM: Yes.
20		MR. LYNCH: And if somebody wanted
21		to paint the brick, what would they do?
22		CHAIRPERSON PEHRSON: Ms. McBeth.
23		MS. MCBETH: They should come and

Page 11 talk to the community development department, and we 1 2 would provide a review of that, probably have our consultant weigh in on that as well. If they insisted 3 that they wanted to do that, it might come to the 4 Planning Commission for a waiver of that. 5 I think what the ordinance is 6 7 saying here is trying to make it even more clear that 8 we don't really want to see painted brick because it's 9 a self-maintaining material. Our facade consultant 10 may attend the public hearing and could handle 11 specific questions at that time. 12 MR. LYNCH: All right. Thank you. 13 That's it. 14 CHAIRPERSON PEHRSON: Thank you. 15 Does the change in the ordinance 16 address some of the newer materials as well that we're now seeing come to the marketplace? 17 18 MS. MELLEM: Yes. 19 CHAIRPERSON PEHRSON: So that would 20 give us some latitude for the -- so we don't look at 21 this every year, we look at this every two, three, four or five, whatever. So materials are changing. 22 23 Do we have language in there that allows maybe

Page 12 administratively or -- to look at that newer material 1 2 and make that part of the ordinance? I think Doug has 3 MS. MELLEM: addressed some of the newer materials in that schedule 4 adding those. I think he usually looks at what the 5 similar material is, if it's something that's an 6 7 absolute new product, or what the intent of the 8 product is. So we can add more clarifying language so 9 that he's entitled to do that as a facade consultant 10 if that what's your interested in. 11 CHAIRPERSON PEHRSON: Thanks. 12 Anyone else? 13 Member Greco. 14 MR. GRECO: I don't think so. 15 I would like to make a motion to 16 set the Text Amendment 18.821 Facade Ordinance Update 17 for a public hearing. 18 MR. ANTHONY: Second. 19 MS. MELLEM: Can I correct that? 20 It's 281. It's wrong on the --21 MR. GRECO: Okay. 18.281. Yes, I 22 accept that in my motion. 23 MR. ANTHONY: Second.

We've divided the report into different 22 23 sections.

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1	The residential section comes
2	first, and you'll probably recognize a lot of those
3	names either under construction now or getting ready
4	to start construction.
5	Offices. Several large office
6	buildings were also approved. The conference center,
7	of course the Suburban Collection Show Place
8	expansion, a gas station, industrial, and three
9	daycare facilities.
10	We also looked at the
11	thoroughfare master plan which was adopted, and the
12	master plan for Wendy's which we're going to be
13	bringing back again now that we're going to have our
14	full quorum back again.
15	CHAIRPERSON PEHRSON: Thanks. It
16	was a busy year.
17	MS. MCBETH: It was. There were
18	100 stampings, which means projects that made it all
19	the way to completion as far as planning is concerned.
20	CHAIRPERSON PEHRSON: It would be
21	my recommendation that everybody on this board get a
22	raise.
23	Any supplemental issues?

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1	And our last audience
2	participation.
3	Seeing one reluctant participant
4	not wanting to participate, we'll close that, and look
5	for a motion to adjourn.
6	MR. LYNCH: Motion to adjourn.
7	MR. GRECO: I'll second.
